



# 2nd World Deaf Youth Badminton Championship 2019 Technical Regulations Taipei, Chinese Taipei

**Updated: 25 Apr 2019**

## 1. EVENTS

Youth badminton competitions will be conducted from 13 to 15 July 2019 and will comprise the following events:

- Men's and Women's singles
- Men's and Women's doubles
- Mixed doubles

## 2. PARTICIPANTS

### 2.1. Age Eligibility

To be eligible to participate in the Youth World Championship, the player must be born on or after **1<sup>st</sup> January 2000**.

### 2.2. Number of Players

Each National Federation may enter a maximum number of four (4) men and four (4) women for the Badminton competition.

### 2.3. Reserves or substitutes

No reserves or substitutes are allowed for the singles. The composition of a pair may be changed only if a federation has entered less than four (4) men and four (4) women for the doubles and one of the players originally entered in a pair forfeits by a doctor's declaration. However, no changes may be made after the draw has taken place.

### 2.4. Non-Starting

A fine of USD \$100 is levied on each non-starting athlete with the exception of those presenting a doctor's declaration that he/she should not be allowed to start.

## 3. REGISTRATION

### 3.1. Preliminary Entry Registration

The preliminary registration with an indication of whether to or not to participate must be submitted to ICSD Technical Director no later than **11 July 2018**. [Not less than one (1) year before the competitions.]

### 3.2. Final Entry Registration

The final entries entry with an indication of the number of athletes in each event must be submitted to the ICSD Technical Director no later than **11 January 2019**. [Not less than six (6) months before the competitions.] Changes to final entries made after the closing date for final entries will only be accepted at the discretion of ICSD and will incur a USD \$100 fee.

### 3.3. Name Registration

The name Registration with the names of each athlete indicating event entered must be submitted to the ICSD Technical Director no later than **11 June 2019**. [Not less than one (1) month before the competitions.] Such submissions will be made by the official registration form.

**3.3.1.** No changes or additional entries will be accepted after **11 June 2019**.

### **4. COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS**

#### **4.1. Technical Organisation**

ICSD is responsible for the technical organisation of the World Deaf Youth Championship Badminton Competitions.

#### **4.2. Committees**

##### **4.2.1. Technical Committee:**

The technical committee will be composed of the ICSD Badminton Technical Director and members appointed by the Organising Committee:

The Championship Protest Committee shall consist of:

#### **4.3. Competition Rules**

The Badminton competitions will be conducted in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the BWF (statutes 30 November 2018). In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the Rules and Regulations, the English text shall prevail. Unforeseen incidents not covered by the Rules and Regulations shall be dealt with as follows:

- 4.3.1.** Cases of a general nature will be resolved in accordance with the ICSD Regulations, World Deaf Youth Championship General Regulations and this Badminton Technical Regulations.
- 4.3.2.** Technical questions related to competition rules shall be resolved according to the BWF Rules and Regulations.
- 4.3.3.** Only athletes who comply with the ICSD Regulations are entitled to take part in the World Deaf Youth Badminton Competitions.

#### **4.4. Competition Equipment**

- 4.4.1.** All equipment and implements used during competitions will comply with the BWF Rules and Regulations.
- 4.4.2.** The shuttlecocks will be Victor Master No.1.

- 4.5.1.** Clean and customarily acceptable Badminton attire shall be worn by all participants and officials in the Badminton tournament. Participants must observe the Deaf World Championship Regulations regarding advertising on clothing, etc., in the Stadium areas.
- 4.5.2.** In the doubles events players must wear the same colour shirts and shorts according to BWF Rules.
- 4.5.3.** It is mandatory for the opposing players in each team, singles and doubles match wear different colours from each other. Preferred colours of shirts need to be registered before the games, according to BWF General Competition Regulations 21.6.
- 4.5.4.** The surname of the player and name of the country on the back of the shirt is mandatory, according to BWF General Competition Regulations 23.3 and 23.4.
- 4.6. Draw**  
The draw for all events will be conducted in accordance with BWF Rules and Regulations. Players from the same country shall be drawn by lot in opposite halves of the draw.
- 4.7. Competition Plan**
- 4.7.1. Singles & Doubles**
- 4.7.1.1. Preliminary Round**  
The players entered will be divided in groups of 3 to 4 players. Each player/pair will play all the other players/pairs in the group. *(This is subject to the number of entries; the mixed doubles event may be played in the knock-out stage only).*
- 4.7.1.2. Finals**  
The players classified 1 and 2 in each group will play a normal tournament competition where only the winners advance to the next round.
- 4.7.2.3. Classification of Players**  
The classification of players in each group shall be made on points, namely: One (1) point for each game won and no (0) points for each game lost. If, at the end of a round, some players have the same number of points, it shall proceed in the following manner:
- a.** If two players have the same number of points, the result of the games between them shall have precedence.
  - b.** If more than two players have equal points, a second classification shall be established, taking into account only the games played between the players with equal points.
  - c.** Should there still be equality, the players shall be reclassified according to their number of sets won subtracted by the number of sets lost, taking into account only the games played among the players with equal points after the second classification.

- d. Should there still be equality of points and sets, the classification shall be made by "goal" (point) average, taking into account the games played among the players with the same number of points.

### 4.8. Officials

#### 4.8.1. Referee

The referee shall be fully qualified and certified by the BWF. The referee shall act in concert with the ICSD Technical Director. However, in matters concerning the interpretation of the Rules of Badminton, the referee's decision shall be final.

#### 4.8.2. Umpire

In the preliminary rounds the singles and doubles, each tie will have one umpire (teller) and two-line judges who will be supervised by the Referee. At quarter-finals and finals there will be fully licensed umpires (teller) and (serve) and four-line judges.

#### 4.8.3. Appointment

The Organising Committee shall appoint an appropriate number of umpires and line judges.

## 5. VENUES

### 5.1. Competition Venues

The 2019 World Deaf Youth Badminton Championship will take place at Taipei Gymnasium, Taipei.

#### 5.1.1. Courts

There will be 8 courts (4 courts each in two separate halls).

#### 5.1.2. Flooring

The competition surface will be hard maple wood and badminton mats.

### 5.2. Training Venues

The training venue is the same as the competition venue.

The second Technical Meeting will be held at (time to be confirmed) on 21 July at Taipei Gymnasium, Taipei.

### 6.3.2. Attendance

Each participating National Association may be represented by two officials, of whom at least one must be deaf and, if necessary, an interpreter.

## 7. CONTROL AND SANCTIONS

### 7.1 Hearing Devices

The use of any hearing aid(s)/amplification or external cochlear implant parts is strictly forbidden from the restricted zone area.

#### 7.1.1. Restricted Zone Area

The restricted zone area is in effect from the time athletes enter on the whole badminton courts hall area during the warm-up and competition period.

#### 7.1.2. Violation and Penalty

When this rule is violated, the match shall immediately be stopped and the offending player/s will be disqualified from the event. Refer to [Audiogram Regulations](#), 8: Violations and Penalties.

### 7.2 Medical Control

Refer to General Technical Rules - World Championships, WC9 - CONTROL AND SANCTIONS.

## 8. PROTESTS

### 8.1. Procedure for lodging a protest

All sport related protests will be resolved in accordance to the BWF Rules and Regulations and will be managed by the Badminton Protest Committee. Any official protest must be submitted in writing in English on the Official Deaf World Championship Protest Form. The form must be given to the ICSD Technical Director with USD \$100 within 60 minutes after official posted results.

8.1.1. The ICSD Technical Director will decide whether the protest is sporting related or eligibility related. The World Deaf Youth Championship Badminton Protest Committee will review all sport related protests, and the ICSD Representative will review all eligibility protests. The deposit of USD \$100 will be returned to the appellant only if the protest is considered valid.

### 8.2. Procedures for reviewing a protest

The Protest Committee will meet in the Technical Director's office at Taipei Gymnasium, Taipei at a time decided upon by the ICSD Badminton Technical Director.

- The ICSD Technical Director will be the chairperson of the committee.
- The Sports Liaison Officer (SLO) will be responsible to book the meeting room and interpreters.
- The Sports Liaison Officer (SLO) will contact all members of the Protest Committee to inform them of the meeting time and location.
- The ICSD Technical Director will be responsible for liaising with the State Sports Association's Competition Manager.
